Assembled into a dynamically growing sculptural environment, the Green light lamps host Green light – Shared Learning, a changing multidirectional weekly program of creative activities and critical discourse.

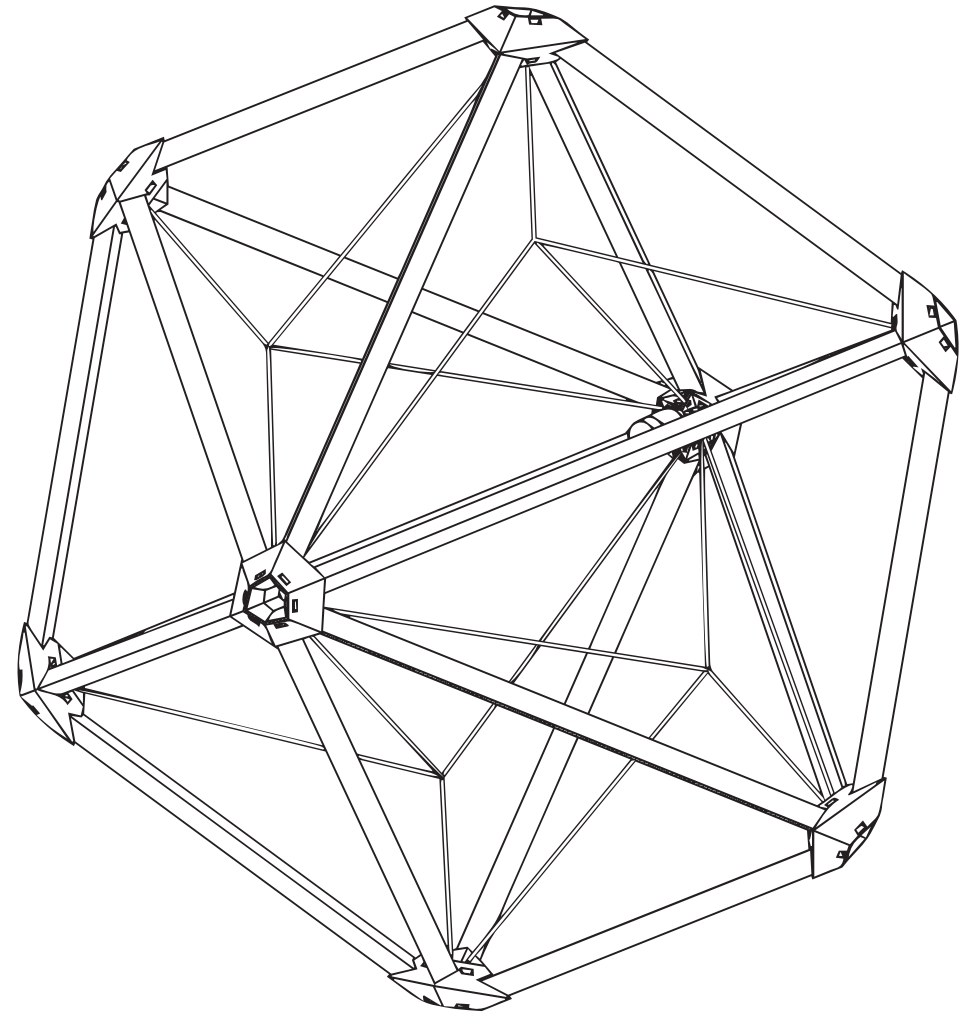

Deep Sleep, 2014
12 min 45 sec

A hypnosis-inducing pan-geographic shuttle built on brainwave-generating binaural beats, Deep Sleep takes us on a journey through the sound waves of Gaza to travel between different sights of modern ruin. Restricted from travel to Palestine, Al Sharif learned auto-hypnosis for the purpose of bi-locating. What results is a journey, recorded on Super 8mm film, to the ruins of ancient civilizations embedded in modern civilization in ruins, to a site ruined beyond evidence of civilization. Deep Sleep is an invitation to move from the corporeal self to the cinema space in a collective act of bi-location that transcends the limits of geographical borders and plays with the fallibility of memory.

Bouchra Ouizguen

Madame Plaza, 2010

Madame Plaza is a documentation of a dance piece created by Moroccan choreographer Bouchra Ouizguen. In the work she and three traditional “Aita” vocalists bring the viewers through a range of emotions, using guttural wailing, powerful bodily gestures, and incantations. In Morocco the “Aita” are simultaneously treated with admiration and fantasy, yet also contempt and rejection. In Madame Plaza, inciting a cacophony of gestures and sounds, both folkloric and contemporary, these women powerfully claim, display, challenge and perform the complexity of their positions, resulting in a visceral sense of freedom and solidarity made visible through their interactions.

What Acts (Upon Us) When We Are Acting? is

theater without theater: We are not acting within the theater or on a stage, playing characters and roles within the unfolding of a given plot, but we are acting outside and around the theater. Without the guidance of a story we are working with the means at hand, the given situation and circumstances: we are engaging in an action that displaces and expands theatrical action into life and interrupts the familiarity of the everyday.

Johannes Porsch is an artist, curator and architect, living and working in Vienna. He teaches at The University of Applied Arts. His work generally looks at narratives and the processes of mediation, between text, image, language and space.
