Friday, October 21, 2022

12:00–2:00 pm - Preview visit to Festival Flora and patio walk

Festival Flora opens its fifth edition, titled “Metamorphosis”, leading us through the most celebrated patios in Córdoba (Mezquita Mosque, Museo Arqueológico, Palacio de Viana, Diputación), featuring international flower artists, including Maurice Harris (US), Cordero Atelier (SP), Yuji Kobayashi (JP), and others.

4:00–6:00 pm – Additional visits in Córdoba to the Mezquita Mosque-Cathedral and the Córdoba Synagogue

Tour of two of the key heritage sites in the city, the Mezquita Mosque-Cathedral and the ancient synagogue, two buildings embodying the different cultures and civilizations that make up the historical fabric of the city of Córdoba.

The Mezquita Mosque-Catedral is the city’s most important building, which was built as a mosque in 784 and extended several times. With an area of 23,000 sqm, it would be the third largest mosque in the world today and has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1984, alongside the entire old town since 1994.

Situated in the Jewish quarter of Córdoba, the Synagogue is one of the three best preserved Medieval synagogues in the whole of Spain. Built between the years 1314 and 1315, it was in constant use until the Jews were expelled from Spain. It was declared a national monument at the end of the nineteenth century.

Saturday, October 22, 2022

11:00 am – Departure by bus to the archeological site of the Caliphate City of Medina Azahara and the museum. Guided tour.

The Caliphate City of Medina Azahara is an archaeological site of a newly founded city built in the middle of the tenth century CE by the western Umayyad dynasty as the seat of the Caliphate of Córdoba. The site is a complete urban complex, including infrastructure, buildings, decorations, and objects of daily use, and provides in-depth knowledge about the material culture of the Islamic civilization of Al-Andalus at the zenith of its splendor.

12:30 pm – Visit to the private Monastery San Jerónimo de Valparaíso. TBC. *By invitation only.*

On the hills above the amazing Medina Azahara, in the mountains of Cordoba and surrounded by native Mediterranean vegetation, stands this impressive private monastery. It was originally Gothic in style, although different reforms in Renaissance and Baroque style have added a wealth of interesting details to the building.
