Organismo Art in Applied Critical Ecologies

Independent Study Program Open call for applications

TBA21–Academy and Museo Nacional Thyssen-Bornemisza present Organismo | Art in Applied Critical Ecologies, an independent study program connecting research, theory, and speculation with specific cases of regenerative interventions that take place through different forms of alliance. The project began with the aim of exploring new methodologies and configurations of actors in processes of ecological transformation. Its foundational hypothesis is that the work of artists leading interdisciplinary projects have great potential to contribute to a cultural paradigm shift that results in new ways of inhabiting the planet that embrace complexity and are inclusive.

Organismo is based on the experiences of TBA21–Academy, Fundación TBA21's research center and incubator for collaborative inquiry, artistic production, and environmental advocacy, which has served for over a decade as a catalyst for new forms of knowledge arising from the relationship between art, science, public policy, and conservation. Based on this same approach, Organismo functions as a system of connections between art practices, interdisciplinary research, government bodies, and local communities to facilitate the co-development of plural and intersectional projects necessary to address the challenges and converging crises of today.

Experimentation with methodologies is inherent in the process of thinking and designing of Organismo. Thus, this year zero of the independent study program is conceived as a prototyping process during which we will test patterns, hypotheses, and organizational structures. To this end, Organismo proposes working from multidisciplinary, multiagent, multiscalar, and multispecies approaches as a way to activate our collective intelligence. Placing artistic practice as a driving force and building bridges between speculation and application, Organismo intends to mobilize cultural and political transformations by developing narratives and languages that would help us imagine other ecological orders.

01. RESEARCH LINES

The research lines of this pilot program respond to the work carried out at TBA21–Academy since its foundation in 2011. They are organized along the following lines:

02. CASE STUDIES

Organismo's study program is structured around applied cases, which for this year zero are:

Depending on location, geographic condition, theme, resources, and availability of the participants in each case study, these will be developed over different durations, through specific compositions of agents, and operational dynamics.

03. PARAMETERS, STRUCTURE AND TIMELINE

This year zero of Organismo's independent study program will take place between January and June 2024. It is designed as a hybrid format (both in-person and online) to be compatible with participants' other commitments, and it combines various types of sessions and meeting formats.

The program's structure involves:

- Encounters that are part of Organismo's public program and are open to the general public. These will take place on Thursday evenings and will explore various formats. Participants of the independent study program will have access to audiovisual recordings from this program in case they cannot attend in person.
- Working sessions specifically intended for participants of the independent study program. These sessions will be conducted online on Friday evenings.
- Collective working sessions organized by case study groups on Saturdays, either in person or online, or as scheduled based on availability of the participants and other people involved.

The schedule has three phases:

Phase 1: Case design January 2024

The design of the approach, the organizational structure, and the process of each case study are developed as the program's initial exercise. This will happen through multiple workshops, including one in-person meeting in Madrid that will involve collaborative work between the complete team working on the case. Participation in the design workshops is mandatory.

 Phase 2: Study, research and understanding of the place February - April 2024

Each case group will undertake a trip to the location of the case study, along with an external agent whose profile, practice, and context will inform the case's themes. This is a mandatory trip covered by TBA21-Academy. Onsite, each group will develop activities or workshops proposed by the accompanying agent.

 Phase 3: Autonomous case development April - June 2024

The groups will then independently continue to develop their project according to the objectives established among all the members over the previous months. In June, a public event will be held to present the cases, the learnings outcomes, and the places reached by the program participants.

The contents and sessions that make up the program will be developed by a selection of people from different disciplines with related practices, both local and international, who make up a diverse group of external guests and team members of TBA21–Academy. 05. APPLICATION

This program is aimed at adults, with no requirement for a degree or other prerequisites, who are interested in interdisciplinary approaches and/or of experience related to the proposed research lines and case studies that will be developed.

Each candidate who applies to participate in the independent study program through this open call will need to choose one of the six case studies. Between 5 and 7 participants will be selected for each study case, so the program as a whole will invite between 30 and 42 participants. Participation in the course costs €310. Organismo will offer a scholarship to six participants, one per case study, who will take on the role of documenting and reporting on the development of the different cases. The scholarship covers the program tuition and provides a grant of €1500.
